

# Pathway to Policy: Integrating Security and Public Health Responses to Firearms Trafficking and Violence in the Caribbean



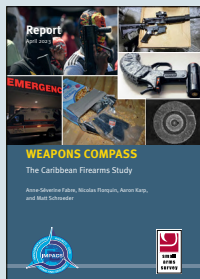

Our work intends to:

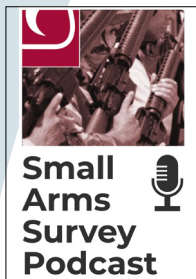
- Enhance the regional integration of the security and public health responses to firearms trafficking and violence
