#### ANNEXE 4.1 ESTIMATION TECHNIQUE FOR SMALL ARMS EXPORTS

To estimate small arms exports of the one major producing country that does not report on its exports—namely China—we have assumed that it is possible to use other states' ratios of small arms exports to total arms exports as a basis for estimation.¹ While in theory simple, this is complicated by the fact that few states provide the data that would make the calculation of the ratio possible (that is, data on total arms exports and total small arms exports). Moreover, among those states that provide both total figures of the arms trade and the SALW share, some use definitions of SALW that are incompatible with the UN definition. Hence, the range of countries whose ratio of small arms exports to total exports could be used is considerably narrowed down. We have thus been obliged to rely on the ratios of only three countries, namely Belgium, Canada, and Switzerland (see Table A1).

A second complicating factor is that China does not publish any official figures on its total arms exports. Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) estimates are based on numbers of weapons, not their monetary value, and so cannot be used here. Another oft-quoted source, the World Military Expenditures and Arms Transfers (WMEAT) of the US Department of State, is published with a four year lag (that is, 1999 data were published in 2003). Thus, we have relied on the *Conventional Arms Transfers to Developing Nations 1994–2001* published by the US Congressional Research Service. According to the 2002 edition of this yearly report, China sold USD 500 million worth of weapons in 2001 (Grimmett, 2002).

Using the ratios for Belgium, Canada, and Switzerland, we can estimate the value of SALW exports of China at between USD 22 million and USD 175 million. An average estimate is hence USD 98.5 million or approximately 100 million. This figure is actually quite close to the figure for the only year in which China published customs data on its SALW exports (in 1998).
